Let's begin with our key words which are profession and occupation, their definitions and how are we going to use said words in this unit.

WHAT IS A PROFESSION?

A profession requires a degree (title) you get one by completing studies at a university or other institutions of higher education.

It involves extensive training and special knowledge for instance: accountant, architect, doctor, engineer, lawyer and (the best) teacher.

You need a degree to work in such jobs.

WHAT IS AN OCCUPATION?

Technically, any occupation is the job which someone is paid to do. It is how anyone earns their living.

Although an occupation is commonly viewed as a fancier word for "JOB" will say that every job that is not a profession is an occupation, so every job that doesn't need special training. For instance: waiter, waitress, sales assistant, cashier & courier. Being a student is also an occupation but one that is not paid at all.
