Present simple vs Future simple

PRESENT SIMPLE

Let's remember that present simple is used to express routines or events that are general true like for instance: verbs are underlined in **bold writing**.

FUTURE SIMPLE.

We must also remember future simple which is what we saw in last week's worksheet, since it is a **FUTURE** tense every use that we are seeing every use must be thought for the future, so we use future simple to talk about **decisions, offerings** and **predictions with no evidence**.

Examples:

Positive sentences.

- I **will help** you as much as I can. (*Offer*)
- Quarantine **will end** by June. (*Prediction with no evidence*)
- I **will eat** something when I'm done with this. (*Decision for the future made now*)

Negative sentences.

- I **will not help** you with your homework. (*Offer*)
- I **will not win** the lottery. (*Prediction with no evidence*)



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Fecha:

I **will not go** out and play football. (*Decision for the future made now*)
